Project Password is a virtual room in the worldwide web where artists from all over the world of different disciplines meet and create a joint art project. The idea was generated by 4 Austrian Artists: Heidi Inffeld, Beate Landen, Gabriele Foissner-Weinländer. Friedrich Moser.

Password is a game with clear rules, so each intervention/modification can be traced. Instead of conventional tools the artists use IT tools for visualizing the text fragments. Every picture they create is posted on our web: WWW. password.or.at. All participating artists may then alter the pictures. Now, in 2008, we have about 50 members in our community. They come from different disciplines - literature, classical music, electronic arts, industrial design, media-art, painting, sculpturing, ceramic arts, performance, photography, interieur design, philopsophy - and integrate their cultural art heritage in their media-artwork. Countries like Australia, Austria, China, Colombia, Germany, Great Britain, Italy, Japan, Mexico, Poland, Spain, Venezuela and USA are integrated in the project at the moment.
