Let's Talk about Racism: German-speaking Universities

"For any discourse, new knowledge claims must be consistent with an existing body of knowledge that the group controlling the interpretive context accepts as true. [...] Because elite White men control Western structures of knowledge validation, their interests pervade the themes, paradigms and epistemologies of traditional scholarship." (Patricia Hill Collins: 2000).

University education in Europe is a white privilege and racism an integral part of the institutional logic and structures of university education. Racism shapes curricula, employment opportunities at the University, professors consultation hours, grading and seminar assignments... and the list goes on. The instrumental role of white-privilege and accompanying power structures in defining knowledge production processes in the German speaking context however, remains conspicuously unacknowledged. Based on her book: *eingeschrieben. Zeichen setzen gegen Rassismus an deutschen Hochschulen*, Emily Ngubia Kessé will define basic theoretical concepts and approaches in addressing discrimination in German-speaking Universities.

No Democratization without Decolonization

Aus der Praxis im Dissens

Universität der Ignorant_innen/maiz/das kollektiv – Rubia Salgado

Rubia Salgado wird in ihrem Vortrag das Buch *Aus der Praxis im Dissens* vorstellen. Das Buch versammelt eine Auswahl von Texten, die Salgado in den vergangenen 20 Jahren im Rahmen ihres Mitwirkens bei der Migrantinnenorganisation *maiz* (Linz, OÖ) verfasst hat. Neben Positionen zu Migrations-, Kultur-, Bildungs- und Sprachpolitiken enthält der Band auch bislang nicht veröffentlichte literarische Texte der Autor_in. Das Private, das unaufhörlich politisch bleibt, und die öffentlichen politischen Positionierungen werden durchgehend miteinander verschränkt: Verletzlichkeit und Widerstand.

Darüber hinaus wird der Vortrag die Arbeit von *maiz* – einem Verein von und für Migrantinnen sowie die Universität der Ignorant_innen vorstellen: den Kampf um Anerkennung, das Wissen um Unterwerfung, die Umarbeitung der Anrufungen, die Fragen nach widerständiger Handlungsfähigkeit, das Annehmen einer strategischen Identität als Ausgangsbasis der politischen Artikulation und das Abtasten der Grenzen eines (selbst)proklamierten strategischen Essenzialismus, das Ringen um Protagonismus und seine möglichen Definitionen und Austragungen, das Zelebrieren einer anthropophagischen Haltung und das Hinterfragen dieses Konzeptes, der Horizont der gegenhegemonialen Wissensproduktion und der Kulturarbeit abseits multikulturalistischer Konzepte und Praxen, das Sich-Wider-sprechen, das transformative Aneignen der hegemonialen Sprache, das Betrachten von Sprache als realitätskonstituierend, das Befragen des Lehrens der hege-monialen Sprache als Zurichtung. Die Bemühung um ein Sprechen und ein Handeln im Widerstand und im Dissens zur herrschenden Selbstverständlichkeit der Diskriminierungen. Ein Schreiben im Kollektiv verortet, eingebettet, eingerahmt. Fragen, Nachdenken und eroberte Perspektiven aus dem Denken und Handeln in einer Selbstorganisation.

Situating Ourselves in Displacement. Conditions, Experiences and Subjectivity across Neoliberalism and Precarity

Displacement is a key paradigm of our time, for those who can afford not to move, to shift, to change, to develop and improve – or to be moved, shifted, displaced?

Situatedness is a key condition for solid and sustainable practices, in politics, arts, research or otherwise. Yet situatedness is not something we can take for granted today. What is the meaning of situatedness within displacement?

What interests us with regard to strategies of situatedness is their pertinence to our own worlds. We, as what may be called knowledge or postfordist workers, live under highly flexible conditions, have grown up at higher points of the welfare state and European mobility, are increasingly displaced from place/identity/profession/class. We gathered around the conceptual pair displacement/situatedness because they stirred something in us, perhaps because despite being highly flexible subjects, we have recently found ourselves in new dilemmas of displacedness, feeling lost, disoriented, out of scale and measure. Perhaps because our relative privilege has shrunk to a critical point, where we stop taking certain things for granted – jobs or career, travels, social security, critical distance, transnational or local roots, certain activisms, certain politics of collectivity and trans/local organizing, certain ways of seeing our position within the wider world, within the European space, within our national, regional, municipal and neighbourhood contexts. We set out to analyze displacement as key dynamic within neoliberalism and explore some of the answers that situatedness may imply.

**The Question of the Institutional in the Biopolitical Economy of

Emerging gestures of collective dissent raise the question of the polis as a multivalent question of be-longing and un-belonging with others and with the world. They also provide the grounds for a critical re-engagement with, and a reflective re-imagining of, who and what qualifies as political subjectivity that can possibly lay claim to the public at a moment marked by the neoliberal corporatization of the public but also the securitization of national space through migrant disposability. This question requires us to rethink and mobilize the biopolitics of routinized effacement and disposability as a performative resource for agonistic political engagement. In my reflections I will try to address the aporias of the “institution” in terms of an im/possible positionality that involves a “with-within-against” movement: a spectral structure of both proximity and distance vis-a-vis the globalized distribution of capital, resources, and bodies.

Situating Ourselves Collectively. Exploring the Embodied Politics, Conditions, Experiences and Subjectivity across Displacement

This workshop will explore the micropolitical aspects and subjective conditions of displacement from an embodied perspective in relationship to collective dynamics and/or individual processes. Emphasizing mapping, diagrams, our bodies and listening as method. We will address the experiences, forms of subjectivity, and material realities generated by displacement within neoliberal capitalism, starting from our own trajectories. As transient subjects – caught between mobility and migration, between precarity and flexibility – displacement implies all kinds of disempowering affects and existential disorientations: precarity, vulnerability, othering; unstable and contradictory relationships of belonging; loneliness, disorientation, anxiety. These experiences of displacement reflect the reality of global capitalism, of bodies being intimately caught in value chains and logistical circuits. This workshop will explore tactics and strategies through which we resolve the contradictions of displacement, testing if they can be collectivized and politicized. We will focus on composition, care, and affect-emotion/feeling-sensing.

Most of Black Students and Students of Colour experience racism and exclusion on their academic path, through teaching materials or interaction with lecturers and other colleagues. This workshop wants to create a space to counteract the individualization of collective experiences, creating a space to network, a space to discuss strategies and to think about possibilities to collectively organize.

We'll break out in smaller groups and collectively share our conclusions. We'll compare the old and the new (media/art/humanities). We'll come up with possible solutions to put an end to these structures. How sexism, racism, sexuality norms et cetera in education influence (the self-organization of) people of colour. The participants can choose one of the following two topics addressed in Workshop A and Workshop B.

Workshop A

To understand how exclusionary mechanisms pervade in the humanities, we must consider the traditional practices of the discipline. Although we might take for granted that fields like philosophy and literature are representative of a white, heteronormative male perspective, we see the same narrative continue into the more contemporary disciplines of (new) media and culture, film studies, etc.

Understanding and undoing this restrictive tradition of art studies requires a comprehensive survey of its foundations, such as the Platonic epistemology of interpretation and the European Enlightenment paradigm. We will consider ways of revising or restructuring these often invisible but omnipresent principles to retrieve the classical humanities from their whitewashing and let the new humanities realize their full potential as emancipatory and socially engaged learning.

Workshop B

Various axes of oppression, such as classism, queerphobia, sexism intersect in ways that are particularly detrimental for students of colour. Students of colour are isolated in academia as a result of exclusionary practices, not only from the white student population but also from each other. Institutional and internalized whiteness and the gendered and sexualized norms encompassed by whiteness stand in the way of self-organization. In this workshop we will identify and discuss mechanisms and tactics employed within academia which lead to the invisibility and isolation of students of colour. In short, how can we mobilize students of colour for decolonization of academic institutions in the face of divisive power relations?

Working Group School Books Free from Discrimination

Discrimination and racism is part of the objectivized knowledge communicated through the images and the language used in official Austrian school books. This leads to a continuation of hegemonic power relations and is therefore in conflict with Article 7 of the Austrian Federal Constitution. *The Working Group Schoolbooks Free from Discrimination* works on strategies and concepts for anti-discriminatory school books.

AG diskriminierungsfreie Schulbücher

The Academy goes to School

The aim of the project *The Academy goes to School* is to facilitate the opening of the Academy of Fine Arts Vienna for students who are currently under-represented at the institution. The initiative *The Academy Goes to School* offers easily accessible information and a number of different activities to explain how one can study at an art university. Furthermore the initiative works towards the implementation of structures that better allow for the entry into an art university. The long-term goal is to work against educational inequality through future-oriented initiatives. Here the focus is on cross-cultural education. Currently, this field of cross-cultural education is established for both teaching staff and students across different departments at the Academy of Fine Arts Vienna.

Die Akademie geht in die Schule

Im Projekt *Die Akademie geht in die Schule* sollen strukturbildende Maßnahmen zur Öffnung der Akademie hinsichtlich jener Studierenden entwickelt und gesetzt werden, die derzeit an der Akademie unterrepräsentiert sind. Die Mittel dafür sind Aktivitäten, die durch möglichst niederschwellige Informationsformate Wege zum Studium an der Kunstuiversität aufzeigen und die Schaffung von Strukturen, die dieses ermöglichen. Langfristiges Ziel ist die Verringerung der Bildungsungleichheit durch zukunftsweisende Initiativen unter besonderer Berücksichtigung der Bedeutung interkultureller Bildung. Das Themenfeld „interkulturelle Bildung“ wird für Studierende und Lehrende der Akademie institutsübergreifend als Lernprozess etabliert.

Working Title Migrarchis

The initiative *Working Title Migrarchis* promotes an archive for migration in Instabul and develops transnational archival politics. The term „Working Title“ refers both to the fact that as of yet there is no archive for migration in Instabul and to the process-based idea and transformation of an archive. Cana Bilir-Meier presents this initiative.

Arbeitstitel Migrarchis

Die Initiative *Arbeitstitel Migrarchis* setzt sich für ein Migrationsarchiv in Istanbul ein und entwirft transnationale Archivpolitiken. Der Begriff Arbeitstitel bezieht sich auf die Abwesenheit eines Migrationsarchives in Istanbul, auf eine prozesshafte Idee und die Transformation eines Archives. Die Initiative wird vorgestellt von Cana Bilir-Meier.

Colectivo Acción Solidaria con México – Austria

We are an impartial group based in Austria. We are mostly Latin American immigrants, but also persons from other countries. Since fall 2014 we have organized demonstrations as well as charity and information events. We came together as a reaction to the impunity, injustice, inequality, violence and corruption ruling in Mexico. We organize in order to make our demands for peace, justice and respect for Human Rights to be heard. We demand answers and pertinent actions concerning the political terror and the case of the 43 students in Ayotzinapa México.

Colectivo Acción Solidaria con México – Austria

ist eine unparteiische Vereinigung, die vor allem aus Migrant_innen lateinamerikanischer Herkunft und einigen Österreicher_innen, aber auch engagierten Leuten aus anderen Ländern besteht und seit Herbst 2014 Demonstrationen, Benefiz- und Informationsveranstaltungen organisiert. Die Gruppe hat sich gebildet als Reaktion auf die Straffreiheit, Ungerechtigkeit, Gewalt und Korruption in Mexiko. Wir organisieren uns, um unsere Forderungen nach Frieden, Gerechtigkeit und Respekt für die Menschenrechte zu artikulieren. Wir verlangen Antworten und Handlungen in Bezug auf den politischen Terror und den Fall der 43 Student_innen in Ayotzinapa México.

Border Crossing & You/Fluchthilfe & Du & You

addresses the critique of the EU border regime and its migration policies. This critique was firstly expressed by the self-organized refugee protest movement in Vienna. Formally *Fluchthilfe & Du* echoes campaigns by Caritas, an organization which collects donations with an appeal to charity while distancing itself from those it denounces as human smugglers: people whose assistance for refugees made it possible for them to come to Austria and to apply for asylum in the first place. *Fluchthilfe & Du/Border Crossing & You* envisions border crossing as a paid service and publicly solicits support for the refugees' struggle for freedom of movement. The work was created as an act of solidarity with those activists of the refugee protest movement who were arrested in 2013 and accused to be members of an international human smuggling organization. Even though the charges that they supposedly earned millions and endangered the lives of refugees in transit were rebutted immediately, the accused were detained for 6 and 8 months respectively and continue to be criminalized to date. In May 2016 the *Border Crossing Tribunal/Fluchthilfe Tribunal* will take place to make visible and to make heard the political demands of refugees. Counter to stigmatization and criminalization of migratory knowledge networks and economies, the initiative *Fluchthilfe & Du/Border*

Crossing & You seeks to intervene into mainstream media and political discourses on human smuggling and border crossing services by way of inscribing this knowledge centrally into the city of Vienna. www.fluchthilfe.at

Fluchthilfe & Du

thematisiert die Kritik am EU-Grenzregime und an dessen Migrationspolitik, welche von der selbstorganisierten Refugee Protestbewegung in Wien aufgeworfen wurde. Formal bezieht sich *Fluchthilfe & Du* auf Kampagnen der Caritas, die mit einem Appell an Nächstenliebe Spenden sammelt, während sie sich gleichzeitig von den als „Schlepper_innen“ bezeichneten Menschen abgrenzt, die Geflüchteten den Weg nach Österreich und zu einem Asylverfahren überhaupt erst ermöglicht haben. *Fluchthilfe & Du* begreift Fluchthilfe als oft entgeltliche Dienstleistung, als Kampf für Bewegungsfreiheit und wirbt öffentlich um Unterstützung. Die Arbeit entstand in Solidarität mit denjenigen Aktivist_innen der Refugee-Protestbewegung, die unter dem Vorwurf, Teil einer internationalen Schlepperorganisation zu sein, im Juli 2013 verhaftet wurden. Obwohl die Vorwürfe, dabei Millionen verdient und Menschen auf der Flucht in Gefahr gebracht zu haben, sofort widerlegt werden konnten, wurden die Angeklagten 6 bzw. 8 Monate in U-Haft festgehalten und werden bis heute kriminalisiert. Im Mai 2016 wird ein auf der bisherigen Arbeit aufbauendes „Fluchthilftribunal“ stattfinden, welches politische Forderungen flüchtender Menschen sicht- und hörbar macht. Es wird entgegen einer Stigmatisierung und Kriminalisierung migrantischer Wissensnetzwerke und Ökonomien versucht, gängige mediale und politische Diskurse zu „Schlepperei“ zu brechen und als kollektives, peripheres Wissen in das Zentrum der Stadt Wien einzuschreiben. In addition to basic education, *PROSA* provides access to professional social care and leisure activities for each of the students who are facing multiple challenges. Currently *PROSA* teaches about 100 students at two public schools in Vienna. So far, 25 students have successfully passed the national diploma exam. www.prosa-schule.org

Who's afraid of the Museum? Una Excavación de las Heridas Coloniales (An excavation of Colonial Wounds)

The museum is confronted as a place of death, a graveyard of stolen objects, snuffed histories and destroyed societies. The works of Latin American women, men and trans artists intervene into the self-image of the museum and show how colonial wounds continue to exist to date. Through ritual, symbolic altars and other gestures they confront the colonial history and structure of the museum and show how this institution was involved in the design of power tools such as racism, the establishment of exoticising body images, the production of Eurocentric knowledge about Latin American cultures etc.

Wer hat Angst vor dem Museum? Una Excavación de las Heridas Coloniales (Eine Ausgrabung der kolonialen Wunden)

Das Museum wird als Ort des Todes verstanden, ein Friedhof geraubter Objekte, ausgelöschter Geschichte(n) und zerstörter Gesellschaften. Mit künstlerischen Arbeiten von lateinamerikanischen Frauen, Männern und Transpersonen wird in das klassische Selbstverständnis des Museums interveniert und aufgezeigt, wie koloniale Wunden bis heute weiter existieren. Mit Ritualen, symbolischen Altären

und anderen Gesten konfrontieren wir die koloniale Geschichte und Struktur des Museums und zeigen auf, wie diese Institution in die Konstruktion von Machtinstrumenten wie Rassismus, der Etablierung exotisierender Körperbilder und der Produktion von eurozentristischem Wissen über lateinamerikanische Kulturen etc. eingebunden war.
